Tanner Smith wrote about cheating on **non-SOL testing** using school-issued laptops and Blackboard at Hidden Valley High School on May 2, 2013: "In a miniature poll of Hidden Valley students, who's [sic] identities will be kept anonymous, one 11<sup>th</sup> grader estimated that in a class of 25 students taking a Blackboard test, ten to fifteen would be cheating. Another student, a 12<sup>th</sup> grader, believes that in the same situation, only two or three students would be cheating. Whichever version is true, students are still cheating on tests."
